Thoughts from Pastor Maureen

It has been a long winter. As I write, the snow is still deep and the small patches of grass that I can actually see are dull and brown. The calendar may say that spring has arrived, but the view from my window does not support that premise. That's human nature: we use our eyes and ears and other senses and make judgments about what's going on in the world.

In Ezekiel 37:1-14 the prophet shares a vision of a valley filled with dry bones. While from a human perspective there appears to be no hope, God sees things differently. God sees the potential for life. God promises to breathe new life into seemingly dead bones.

To be clear, I'm not suggesting that Vasa Congregation looks like a valley of dry bones!

In the last few weeks my spirit has been renewed by the many Vasa members that have stepped forward to take on parish challenges. When the directive came out of the annual meeting to create a task force to handle renovations and remodeling of the church sanctuary; within an hour eight volunteers stepped forward. On March 19 when I passed around the sign-up sheets for assisting with worship the sheets returned filled! And of course there are the many people who volunteer on a monthly basis to help with the community dinner preparation and serving.

Ezekiel closes his prophetic vision with a promise: I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your own soil; then you shall know that I, the LORD, have spoken and will act, says the LORD." The dry bones were restored to life through God's Spirit. Spring will come, the snow will melt, and the grass will turn green, in part because of the way God shaped creation. God's Spirit exists within each of us. God's Spirit breathes in and through us to volunteer in these many ways. God's Spirit continues to breathe in and through us to accomplish God's work in the world.

MAUNDY THURSDAY worship will be held at 7:00pm on Thursday, April 6th in the Sanctuary. Worshippers hear the words of individual absolution as well as receive an anointing with oil. We will celebrate Holy communion as we remember that it was on this night Jesus instituted the sacrament. Finally, the altar area will be stripped of furnishings as a sign of Jesus' abandonment by his followers and friends.



As we gather to remember **GOOD FRIDAY**, we will use a model for worship called "The Way of the Cross." The Way of the Cross is a devotion adapted from a custom observed by Christian pilgrims who said prayers in Jerusalem at a series of places in that city associated with the passion of Jesus.

Traditionally, there have been as many as fourteen stations of the cross. Of these, eight are based directly on events of scripture and are included in this rite. Each station includes sentences and responses, scripture verses, a prayer, and a hymn. Various crosses gathered from Vasa buildings will be no display as we visually move from station to station.



MARK'S MEDITATION


THE PASSION OF CHRIST

Every year during holy week we hear the passion of Christ read in church. But the lectionary, which follows a three-year cycle, gives us just one account in a given year. How do the four Gospel accounts of this story compare? The Gospel of Mark, which was written first (~40 years after the event) has Jesus in despair on the cross, crying, "Why have you forsaken me?" Matthew, written later, has Jesus give a loud cry. Later still, Luke has Jesus speaking of heaven to the thieves also crucified. Finally, sometime in the early 2nd century (~80 years after the event), the author of John has Jesus being stoic. Proclaiming "It is finished." Very different descriptions indeed.

The table below compares the passion account in all four Gospels. Critics like to point out the differences. But, laid out like this, you can see that there is general agreement. The main difference I see is in the telling of events after the resurrection. The Synoptic gospels (Mark, Matthew & amp; Luke) have the disciples meeting Jesus way up in Galilee, but John places these events in Jerusalem. (All passages are from the NRSV.)
