

Thoughts from Pastor Maureen



THE FIRST CHILDREN'S HOME BUILDING.

Matthew 17:20 For truly I tell you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you."

I honestly don't know if Dr. Eric Norelius had faith the size of a mustard seed or if his faith was larger but I can tell you that his work here in Minnesota in the second half of the 19th century moved mountains. Here's one example:

On Saturday, September 20, 2025, Mark and I were invited to attend the Lutheran Social Services of MN (LSS) Fall Gala at the Minneapolis Depot. This event is a major fundraiser for this organization with over 900 people in attendance. Part of the intent of a gala is to raise money for a worthy cause and we witnessed people making pledges in abundance. The final tally was in excess of \$1.4 million dollars. The energy in the room was electric.

My point is not about the money that

was raised. My point is that LSS traces its roots to a need that Vasa Congregation filled back in 1865. A Swedish family had emigrated to Vasa township. Unfortunately the parents died and their four children were left as orphans. Dr. Norelius with the support of the congregation hired a caregiver and arranged for a house to be built to shelter the family. It is from this modest beginning that LSS traces its roots.

Mother Teresa wrote: "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love." The mystery is that God will most certainly use those small things to accomplish amazing things in the world. The origin story of LSS is a testament to that possibility and Vasa Congregation played a role in that.

Trust that you have faith the size of a mustard seed. Be a part of small things done with great love,



The Mobile Pack for Feed My Starving Children will be held at Cannon Falls High School on Saturday, November 8 with set-up on Friday, Nov 7. Last vear over 100,000 meals were packed which went to Cuba and Guatemala. However, with the rise in costs, this year the goal is to pack 85,500 meals which will cost \$25,000. In order to try to help with these costs, the Cannon Falls committee for Feed My Starving Children decided to sell t-shirts and chances to win a quilt donated by Val Haggstrom of Spring Garden. There will be a table in the gathering space for the next few weeks to purchase either t-shirts for \$20, or donations for the quilt. For \$5, you would get 1 chance for the quilt while \$10 gets you 3 chances and \$20 gets 6 chances. For a donation of \$30, you get 7 chances for the quilt plus a t-shirt. 

MARK'S MEDITATION: A TRUE CHRISTIAN



What makes you a Christian? A Catholic (and a Lutheran) might respond by saying that baptism marks a person as belonging to Christ. An Evangelical might respond by quoting John 3:3 which has Jesus say "no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again." That is, Evangelicals believe a personal conversion is necessary to be a true Christian. But what about our earliest (written) evangelist, the Apostle Paul. What does he say marks a person as a Christian?

Paul's longest and most systematic epistle is the letter he wrote to the church in Rome. Unlike his other letters, which were written to churches he had founded, the epistle to the Romans is addressed to an already existing church. In this letter he lays out Christian theology as he understands it in the hope that they would fund his planned evangelistic mission to Spain. In the 12th chapter (Romans 12 9:21), Paul describes how to be a "good Christian."

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil; hold fast to what is good; love one another with true affection; take delight in honoring each other. Do not be lazy; be ardent in spirit; serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of God's people; pursue hospitality to strangers.

Bless those who persecute you; do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be arrogant, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but consider what is noble in the sight of all. Do all that you can to live in peace with everyone.

Beloved, never take revenge upon yourselves, but leave room for the

wrath of God. For it is written, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay, says the Lord." Instead, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink, for by doing this you will heap burning coals [of shame] on their heads." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Notice that Paul says nothing about what to believe; only how to act. Of course, earlier in the epistle (chapter 6) Paul argues that it is Christ's death and resurrection that gives us the courage to act righteously in a sinful world.

We know that our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives. We are no longer slaves to sin.... Do not let sin control the way you live; do not give in to sinful desires. Do not let any part of your body become an instrument of evil to serve sin. Instead, give yourselves completely to God, for you were dead, but now you have new life.... Well then, since God's grace has set us free from the law, does that mean we can go on sinning? Of course not! Don't you realize that you become the slave of whatever you choose to obey? You can be a slave to sin, which leads to death, or you can choose to obey God, which leads to righteous living.

Paul clearly believes that being a Christian entails a "new life." Whether this re-birth occurs because of the sacrament of baptism or because of a conscious acceptance of Christ is immaterial to Paul. As he points out in chapter 12, it is a means to an end; and that end is righteousness.


"Vengeance is mine" is a quote from Deuteronomy 32:35. Here Paul is quoting Proverbs 25:21-22
