

of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' 41 Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; 42 for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, 43 I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' 44 Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' 45 Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' 46 And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Window Repair on the Steeple:

Jim Hedeen of the Window Task Force brought a recommendation to the council that Joe Dietheim of Studio 300 in Red Wing be contracted to remove and rebuild the two windows on the south face of the steeple. The council voted to approve this recommendation and steps were taken this week to move forward on this project. The cost is projected to be about \$12,000.00. This expenditure was approved at the congregational meeting on February 26, 2023. There is money in two memorial accounts to cover this expense.
