VASA SUMMER SERMON SERIES



There will be two consecutive sermon series over the next two months. The first is a four part series on *the 10 Commandments*.

- July 3: Nineteen comes before Twenty-a consideration of God's choice to make the Israelites God's chosen people. This week will provide the theological and narrative context for the law. In other words, why do we need "the law" in the first place.
- July 10: The First Table—Tuned into God. This week is devoted to Exodus 20:3-11; those laws that govern our relationship with God.
- July 17: The Second Table--Turned Toward the Neighbor. Exodus 20:12-16 explicates those laws that govern our relationships with each other
- July 24: The Desires of the Heart: Do not Covet. While this may seem like an odd choice, it emphasizes that so many of our sins start with our desires.

The second sermon series is a six part series on *Biblical Views of Economic Justice*. The first three weeks will examine texts from the Old Testament. Then we will consider three texts from the gospels.

- July 31: Debt Forgiveness & Fair Wages using Deuteronomy 15:1-11 and 24:10-15
- August 7: Loving Your Neighbor & the Stranger using Leviticus 19:9-18, 33-37
- August 14: What Does the Lord Require of You? Using Micah 6:6-15; 7:1-7
- August 21: Jubilee & the Kingdom of Heaven using Luke 4:16-21 and 18:18-30
- August 28: Forgive Us Our Debts using Matthew 6:7-15, 19-21
- September 4: The Poor Will Always Be with You using John 12:1-8

Thoughts from Pastor Maureen

When the apostle Paul wrote his letter to the church in Philippi he wrote as a prisoner who recognized that his life, ministry, and travels were winding down. Yet, even under those circumstances he was able to share beautiful and reassuring words in Philippians 4:4-9 I encourage you to get out your Bible and read the passage for yourself.*

In verses 6 and 7 Paul says, "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Do not worry. That's a tough thing to achieve these days. There's so much to worry about! From health challenges, to high gas prices, to the war in Ukraine, to climate change....the list goes on and on! Wisdom is to recognize that we have no control over these external factors. What we do have control over is our inner emotions including our worry. Sometimes the smartest thing that we can do is let go of our worry. Then we need to strive to fill the gap with another emotion like trust in God. Putting it another way: release the worry, ask God to provide for your needs and then look with eyes of faith for the ways that God is providing. Sometimes we even have to ask God to open our eyes so that we can see that God is providing for us. The end result is that we will be filled with the peace that passes all understanding.

Verses 4-7 are habits of the heart. Verses 8-9 are habits of the mind. But taken together they open us to the peace of God: the peace that is so extensive that it is beyond our imagination.

May you be filled with the peace that passes all understanding, trusting that God will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. You are, after all, heirs of the kingdom and God always takes care of his heir.




