Pastor's Thoughts for October

Vasa Voice Article - October, 2019

Matthew 9:11-13 "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" ¹² But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. ¹³ Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners."

In the last couple of months I have been contacted by a couple of Vasa members asking me to connect with a friend or relative because they have significant health challenges. These folks live locally but do not have any church home. It has been a privilege to visit them and remind them of God's promises. It is deeply fulfilling for me to see the glow of peace in their eyes as they hear that they are beloved by God, cherished by God, and claimed by God.

Jesus was sent to earth to share the true nature of God the Father as one who is loving and merciful. Jesus recognized that his primary mission was to share the good news of God's love and mercy with those who weren't hearing that message. As a follower of Jesus, this is my mandate too: to share the good news of God's love and mercy with others.

How does this translate into our lives? More than anything it translates into two actions.

- 1. Refrain from judgment
- 2. Welcome everyone to the table, whether that is at Sunday worship or Tuesday morning coffee or the Community Dinner.

Marty Haugen writes in his hymn All are Welcome:

Let us build a house where love can dwell and all can safely live....

Let us build a house where all are named, their songs and visions heard....

All are welcome, all are welcome, all are welcome in this place.

There are many things to do including donations of menu items, serving & clean up, and delivery of meals to our shut-Ins.








Seniors Luncheon

- <u>Workroom progress</u>: lots of progress has been made on the kitchen workroom. Cement was poured in the space where the walk-in cooler used to be, new walls erected and both the walls and ceiling now have insulation, vapor barrier, and sheet rock. The painting is also done. Still to be completed: a bit of floor tile, some electrical work, and replacing work benches and shelves. The goal is to have it done by October 1st. The kitchen crew is really excited to have this expanded space to work in come the next Community Dinner.
- <u>Lutheran Center Roof</u>: is complete, including the trim. I didn't realize how much of a burden the leaky roof was to me as the person working in the LC every day. Now I can enter the Center in the morning without having to do a walk through adjusting pans and trash cans to catch the drips.


