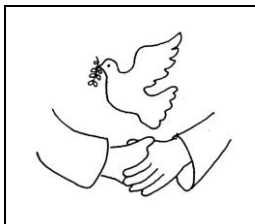

SCRIPTURE READINGS

2 Corinthians 2:1-10 So I made up my mind not to make you another painful visit.
2 For if I cause you pain, who is there to make me glad but the one whom I have
pained? 3 And I wrote as I did, so that when I came, I might not suffer pain from
those who should have made me rejoice; for I am confident about all of you, that my
joy would be the joy of all of you. 4 For I wrote you out of much distress and
anguish of heart and with many tears, not to cause you pain, but to let you know the
abundant love that I have for you. 5 But if anyone has caused pain, he has caused it
not to me, but to some extent-- not to exaggerate it-- to all of you. 6 This
punishment by the majority is enough for such a person; 7 so now instead you
should forgive and console him, so that he may not be overwhelmed by excessive
sorrow. 8 So I urge you to reaffirm your love for him. 9 I wrote for this reason: to
test you and to know whether you are obedient in everything. 10 Anyone whom you
forgive, I also forgive. What I have forgiven, if I have forgiven anything, has been for
your sake in the presence of Christ.

Matthew 18:21-22 Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if another member of
the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?"
Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times."

PROFESSION OF FAITH

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Holy, mighty, and merciful Lord,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
In great love you sent to us Jesus, your Son,
who reached out to heal the sick and suffering,
who preached good news to the poor,
and who, on the cross, opened his arms to all.

In the night in which he was betrayed,
our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks;
broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks,
and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood,
shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.

Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering, therefore, his death, resurrection, and ascension,
we await his coming in glory.

Pour out upon us the Spirit of your love, O Lord,
and unite the wills of all who share this heavenly food,
the body and blood of Jesus Christ, our Lord;
to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit,
be all honor and glory, now and forever.
