OPENING ANNOUNCEMENTS 2 Cor 8:1-15 – Generosity

CALL TO WORSHIP

L: In this world of suffering and poverty, hunger and thirst, violence and tragedy,

C: **Where often we are overwhelmed and even apathetic,**

L: We recall the earliest followers of Jesus, who even in their own poverty,
found something to give.

C: **For if the eagerness is there,
the gift is acceptable according to what one has,**

L: Not according to what one does not have.

C: **There should not be relief for some and pressure for others;**

L: Rather, it is a question of a fair balance between your present abundance
and their need,

C: **So that their abundance may be for your need,
In order that there be a fair balance.**

L: The one who had much did not have too much,

C: **And the one who had little did not have too little.**

L: Nothing left over to the one with the most;

C: **Nothing lacking to the one with the least.**

But enough for all.





MENU: Chicken, mashed potatoes & gravy, corn, refrigerator pickles, rolls and cheese cake.

The Community Dinner was started in 2012 with the purpose of making a connection between the people of the community and the members of the church here in Vasa. We are still doing that with the help of all of your donations and all of the hours that you have volunteered. Thank you!

As we plan the start of our 9th year, we are faced with some very hard decisions brought on by COVID-19. It is very clear that we won't be having a sit-down meal in our building for a while yet, but we feel that we should be reaching out to our shut-ins and other members that, for health and safety reasons, don't feel comfortable gathering in groups of people.

To do this, on September 9th, from 5:30-6:30, we will prepare a smaller scale dinner that focuses on deliveries and carry-out. Meals will be delivered or may be picked up outside the main entrance of the Lutheran Center. In order to receive either delivery or take-out, you will have to order in advance by using an order form. Order forms will be available at church, in the church office, via email, the Vasa Lutheran Website, or—you can also call the church office and leave a message with your NAME, ADDRESS, PHONE, and NUMBER OF MEALS DESIRED. ALL ORDERS must be received no later than Friday, September 4 so we know how much food to prepare. If you are picking up meals, you will be asked to stay in your car and someone will come to your car with your meal—like curbside service!

It is our hope that some of you will consider picking up meals to deliver and share with an elderly person, or a group of neighbors that you are comfortable sharing a meal with. This way we will have many small community dinners instead of one large one, thus safely continuing our tradition of providing meals and fellowship to our community.
