Thoughts from Pastor Maureen

Ashes and Ash Wednesday

The ashes that are used on Ash Wednesday come from the palms that are waved on Palm Sunday. I take some of those leftover palms and hang them to dry. A day or two before Ash Wednesday I get out our table top grill and a propane torch and burn the palms down to ashes. These ashes are typically mixed with olive oil and imposed as a cross on the foreheads of the penitent at the Ash Wednesday service.

This year Ash Wednesday coincided with a Family Fun Night so we held our service in the gym. We read a portion of Psalm 52 and invited everyone to receive the sign of the cross on their forehead. As each individual received the ashes they heard the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

The wearing of ashes was a sign of repentance in biblical times. The ashes of this holy day symbolize two main things: death and repentance. "Ashes are equivalent to dust, and human flesh is composed of dust or clay (Genesis 2:7), and when a human corpse decomposes, it returns to dust."

Participating in an Ash Wednesday service is a spiritual discipline that provides us with a

space to recognize our mortality. Ashes on our forehead is a visible reminder of our sinfulness. They provide a powerful symbol when we recognize that the palms that we waved with joy a year earlier in praise of "King Jesus" have been burned to dust. It reminds us of how frequently we fail to follow the way of Jesus and how all of our best intentions often turn to dust.

As we move through the month of March and look forward to Easter, remember that we have to go to the cross first. Easter cannot occur without Good Friday.

About the Annual Report:

Every year I have to submit an annual report to the national office of the ELCA. Mostly they ask statistical questions about baptisms, confirmations, transfers in and out, and deaths. When I submitted our annual report I was delighted to discover that Vasa gained a total of ten new members over the last year. The breakdown looks like this:

- Baptisms: 4
- Affirmations of Faith: 6
- Transfers in: 5

Total members received this year: 15

• Deaths: 5

Total members removed this year: 5

I recognize that these numbers are not huge. But they indicate that God is not done with this congregation and that there are still people who are choosing to be a part of our ministry. Remember Aesop's fable about the tortoise and the hare? Slow and steady wins the race. We don't have to be in a hurry; we just need to keep on doing what we do, which is to share God's love with the world.

About The Endowment:

When Delores Fremouw died, she gave Vasa Congregation farm land which was subsequently sold. The proceeds of that sale were in excess of \$825,000. With this gift, Vasa established our Endowment Fund. Over the last 23 years "more than \$833,000 has been disbursed to continue God's work at home and around the globe." We have given away the equivalent of the original investment!

The power of creating an endowment fund is that the money continues to grow. Even though we have given away \$833,000 the total assets remain at approximately \$1,124,000.00. It is exciting to consider how we might continue to support various ministry efforts using the proceeds of this fund as a resource to do God's work in the world.

A 2024 MN state law requires any hourly employee accrue one hour of paid time off for each 30 hours of work. Office and janitorial positions are the Church's only hourly positions. The budget for these positions will be reviewed and probably increased.

Insurance expense was 108% of budget because Church Mutual required five payments in 2023. There will be four billings in 2024. The church finished the year in a strong financial position.

HOW MANY PEOPLE DO WE REACH WITH LIVE-STREAM?

Google provides a number of (anonymous) measurements of who is watching YouTube videos. Some statistics, like the age of the viewers, is not available because we don't have enough viewers. However, there is much to learn by reviewing the reports.

When we stream a Sunday service, the YouTube control panel on the computer in the back of the church will show how many people/devices are watching live. This is usually around 15 to 20 viewers. By the end of the service, the total views will be a little more, around 25 views. Clearly, some people are checking in on their phones for just a few minutes. (Presumably, to see if grandpa and grandma are in church.) However, over the next week or so, many more people find and view our service. On average, each video is watched 56 times. Last year, several videos were watched over 90 times. (Not just the Christmas program!) This number has increased over time. The average was 53 views a year ago.

We know that many people watch the entire service; while others just check in for a minute or two. The combination of these two groups makes the reported average watch duration for our videos 21 minutes. Since most Sunday services are 50 to 60 minutes long, and if we make the assumption that the casual viewers are only watching for about one minute, we can make an estimate of how many people watch service all the way through. After doing some algebra, this turns out to be an average of 16 people watching live and another 16 people watching the (whole) service later.


That means we are reaching about 32 households every week. This is half-again as many people as worship in person. Personally, I think we often meet God in the people around us. So, coming inperson, surrounded by the congregation is best. But our streaming efforts are real evangelism.
