

## Thoughts from Pastor Maureen

One of my favorite verses is Psalm 1:3 which says "They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper." Part of the beauty of this image is to remind the reader that patience is an important part of life. Trees don't grow quickly. They don't yield fruit quickly. But eventually they will. The same is true for people. We mature slowly. It takes time for us to grow to the point where we start having an impact in the world.

This is a picture of Flo the Philodendron. This plant was propagated from a "parent plant" that makes its home at the SEMN Synod office of the Bishop. Flo the Philodendron isn't very big right now, but philodendrons are very hardy and there is little doubt that she will grow. Like the tree described in Psalm 1, she will yield her fruit in season and her leaves will not wither. Flo is going to live throughout the summer (and perhaps longer) in the Vasa Church sanctuary. As she does so she will remind us to be patient as we watch her grow.

Every congregation in our synod received one of these plants at the end of the synod assembly in early May. Considering that there are 165 congregations in the synod, it was a significant endeavor to nurture so many plants. The synod staff asks that this plant remind us that we are all called and we are all connected through the power of Jesus Christ.

Below is the Easter Letter written by our Bishop, Regina Hassanally, on April 8th. Even though we just completed the season of Easter with Pentecost on May 28, the message in this reflection bears sharing.

The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here but has risen." Luke 24:5

Sitting in church the morning of Palm Sunday, I heard for the first time a certain desperation in the cries of *Hosanna!* as the gospel text was read. The crowd of people gathered around Jesus as they threw their cloaks and palms before him, crying, "Save us! Save us!"

I have been paying attention to that sense of desperation as I think about all things from which we might ask to be saved. As we approach Easter morning, I think of the women at the tomb. They must have been desperate in their grief.

They approached the tomb looking for a body to bathe and properly prepare for burial, a body to be centered in the rituals of death. What they found was an empty tomb flanked by men in dazzling clothes asking them, "Why are you looking for the living among the dead?"

I wonder, what are we looking for, and where do we expect to find it?

It strikes me the women were not looking for the living. They went to the tomb looking for the body of one who had died. What the women found in the empty tomb was not what they sought but what they needed so that they could be saved.

Part of the Good News of Easter is that in Christ, we are given what we need before we even know we need it. We find within the depths of death the beginnings of new life. We find within the hollow space of the empty tomb that which we have been seeking all along. We have been saved!

I pray as you celebrate this Easter season, which is indeed forty days, you find what you are looking for. I trust that whatever you seek, even those things you long for but cannot yet name, will all be found in the presence of the living Christ.

## MARK'S MEDITATION

#### Is GOD LOVE?

Our Christian scriptures speak of God's love; particularly in the gospel of John. Here are two examples: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16) And, "We know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them." (John 4:16)

But what IS love? There is no deeper philosophical question. It is so hard to answer that for millennia, people have resorted to song or poetry to try to get to its core. My favorite definition of love is attributed to TV-chef Julia Childs. She said "To love something is to never grow tired of it."


In a recent interview, Manuel Cruz, Associate Professor of Theology at Belmont University, describes God's love as one end of a moral continuum between love and justice. Morality is our relationships with each other. To manage those relationships, we have the law (both civil law and scriptural law). But law by itself is insufficient. In Galatians chapter 5 St. Paul says "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." There is no law for or against such things, because these things are far deeper.

Cruz, whose teacher was French philosopher Jean-Luc Marion, says, "When we say I love you we say, 'Here I am. I am here, and I am willing to make room for what it is that you bring into this relationship.'" Marion says that when we love, it's not giving something to another. But it's actually creating the space within our own life, to let that other person give themselves as they really are.

This is also the nature of God's love for us and our love for God. That when God loves, he creates a space within himself for us to exist. He wants us to be ourselves and so God creates a world in which we can exist in relationship to him. And God invites us to hear him say "I am here, I am here inviting. I am here because you are of concern to me, because I love you."

The greatest example of this love is on the cross. There Christ breaks the power of sin, the power of evil, by refusing to return violence for violence. Rather than being driven toward vengeance, God gives himself over to offering love instead of vengeance.
