

Thoughts from Pastor Maureen

"In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed." (Psalm 139:16)

None of us likes to think about the end of our lives, much less about making the final arrangements for our funeral and burial. But I can most certainly assure you that you will be doing your surviving family a huge favor if you make plans and share those plans with them. In my 14 year career as a pastor I've officiated at over 70 funerals including the planning sessions. The sessions that were memorable were the ones where the family had no guidance from the deceased and in the midst of their grief had to make tough decisions; decisions that not all of the family members necessarily agreed with. But there were also the beautiful funerals where the deceased and their family had put together a framework within which to work.

So what do you need to decide?

- Whole body burial or cremation
- Pick out a casket or urn
- Pick out a headstone
- Where to be buried-have you got a cemetery plot or a columbarium niche?


- Scripture texts for the funeral
- Favorite hymns for the funeral
- Communion at the funeral
- Write (or start to write) your obituary
- Reception following the funeral (or not), where, what to serve

Funerals are not for the benefit of the deceased. Funerals are for the living. They can be an important way to bring closure to your family and friends. Having a funeral may not seem important to you but your planning can be a valuable parting gift to those who remain.

In John 14:2-3 Jesus gives us this powerful promise. This is a promise we hang on to in our grief, *"In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?*

And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also."

That we may be there also. Let it be so, Lord, let be so. Amen.

MARK'S MEDITATION

A CREATED UNIVERSE

There are certain physical constants that appear to be true everywhere. (Except possibly inside a black hole, which we cannot observe.) These constants, sometimes called *laws*, cannot be derived mathematically, they must be measured. The four most fundamental constants are:

<u>Gravitational constant = 6.7e-11 m³/kg/sec²</u> Speed of light in a vacuum = 299,792,458 m/sec Plank's constant = 6.626e-34 kg \cdot m²/sec Boltzmann constant = 1.38e-23 m² \cdot kg/K \cdot sec²

The gravitational constant shows up in Isaac Newton's 1687 equations of *gravity* and in Albert Einstein's 1915 equation of *general relativity*. The speed of light shows up in James Maxwells 1862 equations of electromagnetism as the *permittivity* and *permeability* of free space. (And in Einstein's equivalence of mass and energy.) In 1900 Max Planck postulated that there is a minimum distance and minimum energy that *quantizes* physical events; thus, kicking off quantum physics. (Which Einstein used to describe the photoelectric effect—that guy again.) Finally, the Boltzmann constant, named for Ludwig Boltzmann was defined in 1901 by Max Planck to describe entropy. (Which Boltzmann first described in 1877.) These values, plus a set of constants in the *Standard model* of quantum physics which describe the inner workings of protons, neutrons and electrons, precisely define our universe. ...Everywhere ...always.

This understanding of the universe, developed over the last 330 years, appears to leave little room for God.

It is true that when we look carefully, God never breaks His physical laws. But we can thank God for that! Because of this steadfastness, we get to fly in airplanes, talk on cell phones, and administer vaccines. However, when we look closely, the universe looks created. These constants appear to be fine-tuned for biological life. Also, the fact that matter and energy are, at the bottom, quantized into discrete packets, looks suspiciously similar to decisions made by modern engineers and scientists to create products using digital rather than analog techniques.

There is a mystery in modern physics called the double-split experiment. If you shine a light through a barrier with two slits and observe the pattern on a wall behind the slits, the light will behave like a wave and you will see a pattern of multiple light and dark areas as the waves constructively and destructively interfere. But, if you reduce the light intensity so that you can measure each individual (quantized) photon as it travels through either the right or left slit, the interference pattern disappears. You will only observe a pattern of two lit areas on the wall. It is as if the photons know you are looking at them! It seems that God's existence is something like the double-slit experiment. We cannot observe or measure God. Modern miracles can always be explained away when examined closely. It appears that God knows when we are looking.

Yet, we live in a world *designed* to nurture us. Our DNA contains instructions that allow for love and charity. We just need an understanding that allows us to experience these gifts. As Christians, we think that Scripture gives us this understanding.

Although you will not find the Boltzmann constant in the epistles of Paul, you will find an argument for grace. Paul states that the actions of Jesus are a means of salvation. That when you consider what Christ as done for you, you cannot help but be righteous. This is surely how God intended His creation.
